What To Do at Evangola State Park

CAMPING - 80 campsites and 2 Yurts are open from mid-April to late October and offer tent options as well as trailer sites. Flush toilets and hot showers are available in the park as well as electric and handicapped sites. One cabin that sleeps six is available. Reservations may be made by going to www.nysparks.state.ny.us.

PARKING - The camping unit & one vehicle may be parked on a site. In the tent only loop vehicles must park in the parking lot.

RECREATION - Swimming and fishing are perfect at Evangola but the park also features baseball and basketball fields, tennis, disc golf, volleyball and horseshoes. In the winter, enjoy cross country skiing, snowshoeing and snowmobiling.

<u>PICNICKING</u> - There are several picnic shelters to choose from at Evangola. There are nine shelters that can hold up to 90 people, one shelter that holds up to 150 people and four shelters with electricity. For shelter reservations, call (716) 549-1802.

WEDDINGS - Celebrate your special day in our Wedding Gazebo, surrounded by lovely flower gardens and overlooking Lake Erie. For your reception or other special event, our banquet room seats 120 people and overlooks the beach.

SNACK BAR - candy bars, chips, ice cream, soda, water, cheeseburgers, hot pockets, etc.

INTERPRETIVE PROGRAMMING:

Learn about nature with programs sponsored by Niagara Region Parks Interpretive Programs Office. Hikes, walks and other special events take place year round. Special Passes

The Access Pass is available to New Yorkers with qualifying disabilities. The Golden Park Program allows New York State residents 62 years of age or older unlimited weekday and non-holiday access to all state parks by showing a NYS driver's license or non-driver identification. The Empire Passport provides unlimited vehicle entry to most state parks and recreation areas. Passes can be purchased in person at most state parks or recreation areas, or by mail from State Parks, Albany, NY 12238.





Please Remember
